**NOTICE OF TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC
LOW TRAFFIC INITIATIVES ROAD CLOSURES
ELGIN ROAD, CROYDON
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14(2)**

Croydon Council, in pursuance of Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, hereby gives notice as follows:

1. The Council is satisfied that due to the likelihood of danger to the public during the current Covid-19 pandemic, it is necessary or expedient to restrict use of the carriageway as specified in paragraph 2 below for purposes connected to the coronavirus, which are to facilitate safer access for residents to their streets and enable them to exercise and maintain social distancing.
2. During the period starting at 13.00 hours on 11 July 2020 Elgin Road will be closed to vehicular traffic at the following dates and times, during which no person shall cause a vehicle to proceed in Elgin Road.
 - Saturday 11 July 2020 From 13.00 to 22.00
 - Sunday 12 July 2020 From 13.00 to 22.00
 - Saturday 18 July 2020 From 13.00 to 22.00
 - Sunday 19 July 2020 From 13.00 to 22.00
 - Saturday 25 July 2020 From 13.00 to 22.00
 - Sunday 26 July 2020 From 13.00 to 22.00
3. The restriction specified in paragraph 2 above shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.
4. Whilst the closures are in force, the diversion routes for traffic will be via Lower Addiscombe Road, Havelock Road and Addiscombe Road (and vice versa) or (southbound only) via Lower Addiscombe Road, Clyde Road and Addiscombe Road.
5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) a pedal cycle;
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer;
 - (d) a vehicle being used for the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
